Certificate in Global Studies

The Certificate in Global Studies is designed for students wishing to develop expertise in cultural, political, and economic phenomena that cross or transcend national boundaries. Courses offer intensive training in the anthropological analysis of international issues, such as migrations and diasporas, environment and development, flows of money and commodities, social movements, transnational religious movements, and ethnic, national, and other forms of political conflict.

Requirements

- Colloquia summaries CANNOT be turned in after the final submission deadline
